December Newsletter



The 2020 North American Indigenous Games (NAIG) will be held July 12-18, 2020 (travelling July 11-20th) in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The Games will take place in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people.

The Canadian teams competing in the 2020 NAIG are: British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, Eastern Door and the North (Quebec), New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland & Labrador, Yukon, Northwest Territories, and Nunavut – for a total of 14 Provinces and Territories.

The American teams competing in the 2020 NAIG are: Region I (Washington, Alaska, Hawaii), Region 2 (California, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon), Region 3 (Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah), Region 6 (Minnesota, Illinois, Iowa, Missouri), Region 8 (Wisconsin, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana), Regions 9 (Connecticut, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Maine, Vermont, Rhode Island), Region 10 (Haudenosaunee, New Jersey, Pennsylvania), and Region 12 (Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Caroline) with a total of 32 States represented.

Flight Information

Team MB departure date is July 11th, 2020. The flights will take off from Winnipeg International Airport and are booked with Air Canada. There will be 8 departing flights throughout the day that the athletes will be on. They have been booked as "group bookings" and cannot be modified.

Athletes will receive their flight itineraries in May 2020. ALL athletes must arrive in Winnipeg BEFORE the 11th and be at the Staging Event by their designated time. Teams will be travelling together on the same flight.

The earliest flight departs at 6:20 am. The athletes on this flight will arrive at the airport from the Staging Event at 4:20 am, as it takes that long to get everyone through security and boarded. The last flight departs at 2:30 pm.

Your designated flight time will depend on team size and plane capacity. We cannot guarantee what time your team will fly out until you receive your itinerary in May. Your itinerary will contain flight and baggage information as well as a packing list.

All athletes, coaches, and managers fly back to Winnipeg on Monday July 20th, 2020. There will be 8 return flights.

It is mandatory that ALL Team Manitoba Members MUST travel to and from the games as a team. If any special requests for travel <u>AFTER THE GAMES</u> have to be made, you must contact Mel Whitesell in writing, <u>mel.whitesell@sportmanitoba.ca</u>, **prior to Dec 15, 2019**. The only athlete travel home requests that will be accepted must be with the parent/legal guardian. If submissions or inquires are sent <u>after</u> December 15th, it will not be accepted due to Airline Ticketing! <u>NO EXCEPTIONS!</u>

Note: Our organization will be unable to help with any personal travel plans for our supporters wanting to fly and travel to the games. Please use the above information to make all travel arrangements.

There will be a staging event at a community centre in Winnipeg prior to all flights. At this event athletes will be given their team clothing and bags, information about airport security and will board a bus to the airport as a team.

Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The 2020 NAIG will begin with the Opening Ceremonies on Sunday July 12, 2020 at Scotia Bank Centre. There will be no competition this day. All athletes will be encouraged to carry their own community flag during the ceremonies! More details and event schedules can be found on the official 2020 NAIG website at www.naig2020.com when they are available. Online broadcast for the 2020 NAIG is to be determined.

A Cultural Village will be set up at the Halifax Commons for the duration of the Games. There will be many free events at the Village such as performances by artists and dance groups, concerts, cultural teachings, campus information and more! All will be open and available to the public.

The Closing Ceremonies will be held Saturday July 18th, 2020 at the Garrison Grounds following the final soccer and lacrosse games. The 2017 NAIG Closing Ceremonies presented an opportunity for athletes to celebrate their achievements through cultural performances, remarks from leadership, activities, and a Much Music Dance Party! We look forward to seeing what this years' closing ceremonies will bring.

Sports and Competition Schedule

The following sports will be showcased at the games: 3D Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Baseball, Box Lacrosse, Canoe/Kayak, Golf, Softball, Soccer, Swimming, Volleyball, Beach Volleyball Wrestling, and Rifle.

Team Manitoba will be competing in all sports with the exception of: Rifle, Baseball and Beach Volleyball.

The competition schedule is not finalized nor is it available at this time. The final schedule will not be available until <u>2 months prior to the games</u>, after it has been developed by the Host Society and approved by NAIG Council.

<u>Reminder</u>: Practices and training will differ between teams. Please contact your coaches for any questions regarding practicing and training.


Transportation in Halifax

Important Note: All athletes **MUST be wearing their OWN badge AT ALL TIMES**. The badges are used for entry into the following venues: sport venues, athlete villages, meal rooms, busses, etc. Without this, the security at the doors WILL NOT let you in, even if you are wearing your team Manitoba apparel. Security is and will be taken seriously at the 2020 Games.

Fee Information

Athlete's fees are now due!

Total fees are \$1,600 per athlete - \$200 was due on October 31st, 2019. A payment plan has been conveniently set up for families. Further instalments of \$700.00 are due: **January 15/2020 and February 15/2020**. If no arrangements are made with the MASRC office and no payments have been received, consequences such as athlete removal from Team Manitoba may be given. The methods of payment are: Money Order, Certified Cheque, Cash in person, E-transfer or Branch to Branch.

Answer: NAIG2020

The total cost covers the following: Team Uniforms, Athlete Apparel including a Team Manitoba Jacket, T-shirt, Shorts, Hoodie, Baseball Cap, Travel Bag and sandals, Administration, all Meals, Accommodations, Flights to/from Halifax, on-ground transportation at the games and NAIG Host Fees. The only extra money needed for athletes would be for extracurricular and shopping.

<u>Reminder</u> from a 2017 NAIG parent: Look into nationwide calling plans for your athletes prior to leaving for the games. Last games some athletes ended up with 700\$-800\$ phone bills.

Apparel

All participants have sent in their sizes for their apparel and the Team MB gear is ordered! Gear will be given to athletes the day they leave for the games at the Staging Event (July 11, 2020).

The Fan store will be reopening in the New Year! Hoodies and t-shirts will be available for sale.

- Indigenous Ancestry (Copy of Metis/Treaty Card or Geneology) needs to be valid (not expired) – PAST DUE -PLEASE SEND ASAP
- Deadline for requests for athlete return travel arrangements -December 15, 2019
- Payment Installments of \$ 700.00 x 2- January 15, 2020 and February 15, 2020
- Travel Consent Forms: Dec 15 (Only needed if you have NOT already sent it in)

They get a chance to build significant friendship with new communities over the 7 days they are there. We appreciate all the parents that are planning to come out to watch and support! Zero Tolerance Policy

Reminder: NAIG Council has a Zero Tolerance Policy. If athletes are caught breaking the below policy, the athlete will be sent home at the expense of the parent.

I.I. Zero Tolerance Policy


In its promotion of a drug and alcohol free event, the NAIG Council is opposed to the use of illegal drugs, alcohol, cannabis, non-traditional use of tobacco, e-cigarettes and solvents within the NAIG. The NAIG Council is also opposed to the use by athletes, coaches and officials, any banned and restricted substances for the purpose of performance enhancement. Zero tolerance means that behavior contrary to the above will not be tolerated and will result in the immediate loss of all privileges associated with participation in the Games. Incidents that involve the use of illegal drugs, alcohol, cannabis, non-traditional use of tobacco, e-cigarettes and solvents are normally dealt with on an individual team basis through their own disciplinary procedures. These procedures could result in the individual(s) being removed from the Games and reported to the Host Society. Teams are responsible for making the appropriate arrangements to remove team members from the Games.
