




## Welcome Rochelle Guiboche and Cadin Dupasquier!

- 1) Community Softball Coach Clinic on April 7<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Keeseekoowenin Ojibway First Nation.
- 2) Canoe Coach Certification Clinic on June 29th, 2018 in Opaskwayak Cree Nation (OCN).
- 3) Canoe/Kayak Camp on June 30<sup>th</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> in OCN open to all male and female athletes under the age of 19.
- 4) Soccer Camp on July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Winnipeg open to all male and female athletes under the age of 19.
- 5) Volleyball Camp on July 9<sup>th</sup> –11<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Winnipeg open to all male and female athletes born between 2001-2005.
- 6) Drop-in Basketball Skills Camps starting July 2<sup>st</sup>, 2018 in Winnipeg every Saturday Freight House from 4 8 PM for athletes born in 2001 2008. **This camp is ongoing until December and open to new participants!**
- 7) Multi-Sport Camp on August 7<sup>th</sup> –10<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in Winnipeg open to all athletes born between 2001-2007. (Basketball, Athletics, Wrestling, Badminton, Softball, Box Lacrosse, Metis Jigging and Powwow Dancing)
- 8) Canoe/Kayak Camp on August 18<sup>th</sup> –19<sup>th</sup> in Peguis open to all athletes under the age of 19.
